## Dear Middle School Parents,

As you know, Mathematics Explorations is designed to broaden students' understanding of foundational algebraic and geometric ideas through exploratory and inquiry-based learning activities. These synergistic activities require students to work with their peers on a daily basis. Students receive real-time feedback from their classmates and teachers to complete these project-based tasks.

Due to the nature of Mathematics Explorations, it would not be possible to replicate the highly collaborative, project-based, authentic learning experiences with fidelity in the At-Home Learning environment. Therefore, Mathematics Explorations will run as a support and enrichment program during At-Home Learning.

To that end, we have prepared this FAQ to address questions regarding Math Explorations and what the course will look like virtually.

# • Why have we made the change?

We have made this change because it would be impossible to replicate the course with fidelity in the home setting. Additionally, we have elected to provide a more individualized instructional approach for students and provide them with support and enrichment related to the material they are learning in their math class.

# • When should my child report to Math Expo?

Students will follow their normal schedule for Math Expo. For example, if Dr. Holloway has Math Expo, period 5, Days 4-6, he would report to Math Expo via Google Classroom on those days during period 5.

#### • When will the change take effect?

The change will take effect on Tuesday, March 31st which is a Day 4. Prior to March 31st, students will be asked to complete a math self-assessment survey via a Google Classroom announcement. The math self-assessment survey will assist teachers in tailoring support for all students.

### • How do students get a grade for Math Expo?

Although students will not be assigned a letter grade, students will receive grades that indicate "complete" or "incomplete". The notification of "complete" or "incomplete" will be recorded in the teacher's gradebook and can be viewed via PowerSchool. Marking period 3 grades, earned prior to At-Home Learning, will remain in the grade book.
