Illness: (Regardless of vaccination status and/or Post COVID-19 Illness within the last 90 days)

Students that have tested COVID positive may return to school if:

- It has been 5 full days after the onset of symptoms or if asymptomatic after the positive test. (onset of symptoms is day 0; if asymptomatic, the day the test was performed is day 0. (Anticipated return to school insert date)
- If asymptomatic when the test was performed but symptoms appear within one week of the positive test, the 5-day isolation period starts over with day 0- being the first day of symptoms.
- The student has been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- There has been improvement in other symptoms. (e.g. cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, vomiting).
- The student is able to comply with the Return Protocol for Days 6-10. (See Below)

Students with COVID-19 symptoms must quarantine at home until the COVID-19 test results are available. May return to school:

- With improved symptoms and with a negative PCR COVID-19 test. (Documentation to be provided to the school nurse.)
- With improved symptoms and a negative rapid antigen test performed at a healthcare facility (Documentation to School Nurse)
- With improved symptoms and Two (2) rapid home tests administered at least 24 hours apart, yielding negative results along with the signed completion of the Attestation form located in PowerSchool Parent Portal.
- May return if there has been no potential exposure to a COVID-19 case in the last 5 days AND they have an alternative diagnosis
 from a healthcare provider. (URI-Upper Respiratory Infection is not an acceptable alternative diagnosis)
- If not tested, must remain in isolation for 5 days from symptom onset, and may return only if symptoms have improved or resolved, and then follow student return protocol for days 6-10 (See Below) Anticipated Return Date (Insert Date)

Return Protocol for Days 6-10

- Students must wear a well-fitted mask at all times indoors on Days 6-10.
- Students will be excused from any activity that would require the removal of a mask.
- During lunch, maximum distancing should be maintained and masks worn whenever not actively eating or drinking
- If the student cannot wear a mask at all times or does not wear the mask properly (Covering the nose and mouth), the student will be expected to complete a 10 day isolation period.

Close Contact to an Individual that tested Positive for COVID-19.

Everyone that has been exposed as a close contact at school should:

- As a precaution, we recommend wearing a well fitting mask around others for 10 days from their last date of close contact.
- Monitor for symptoms for 10 days. If they develop, get tested and follow the above protocol for illness.
- Consider testing on day 5, unless they have had confirmed documented COVID-19 in the last 90 days.
- Limit participation in extracurricular activities.

QUARANTINE and exclusion from school is needed for students that are <u>household contacts</u> of an individual with COVID-19 that are not eligible for vaccination, are not up to date* with vaccination or are unvaccinated.

During quarantine students will:

- Stay home and away from others for at least 5 days (day 0 through day 5) after the last close contact with a person who has COVID-19. ** The date of the exposure is considered day 0. Anticipated Return Date
- Monitor for symptoms If they develop, get tested and follow the above protocol for illness.
- Consider testing on day 5 (recommended but not required).

*If the COVID + person:

- Can isolate away from the student, the student starts their 5 day quarantine from the last date of close contact. Last date of contact is day 0. (Total 5 days)
- Cannot isolate but can wear a well fitted mask in the household through day 10 of isolation, the student's 5 day quarantine starts the day after the COVID+ individual's 5th day of isolation. (Total 10 days)
- Cannot isolate or wear a mask. The student's 5 day quarantine starts on the day after the household member completes their 10 day isolation period. (Total 15 days)

^{*}As soon as the student receives the booster they are considered up to date, and would be exempt from quarantine.

^{**}In all risk levels, students who are not vaccinated with all recommended vaccines including the booster and who are household members of a person with COVID-19 compatible symptoms that meet COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria must be excluded from school until the symptomatic individual provides one of the acceptable forms of clearance listed above.
