We have \$480 so far and someone is pursuing having their company match their donation! Wow!

New Business:

Programming (Susan Pastir):

- Reflections Arts Program
 - The Reflections Arts Program kicked off on September 18th with our ad in the weekly Sunday eblast. This year the theme is "I am hopeful because...". Students are encouraged to respond to this theme through a variety of art forms including visual arts, dance, literature, music, photography and film. The deadline to enter is November 20th. Mary Cherian is our chairperson. We may look for teachers to promote this program in their classrooms by sharing a poster to display. Request a flyer to hang up in classrooms. - Walk to School



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Shannyn and Sonal have begun planning for our annual Walk-to-School Day that will take place on October 4th. We will have three different meeting places - the top of the back path, the corner of Trenton and Martine, and the parking lot by the Kramer Manor tennis courts. Councilperson and McGinn parent, Matt Adams, has accepted the invitation to meet us at the Kramer manor parking lot near the tennis courts to walk to school with the children. Flame most likely will also make an appearance. We may look for staff members to meet at one of the three meeting places to make the experience extra special for kids. 8:15 meeting time.

• Week of Respect & Assembly

- McGinn's Week of Respect will run from Monday, October 2nd through Friday, October 6th. We will continue to place an emphasis on practicing kindness with various suggested activities planned throughout the week, one being "chalk kindness" while the kids are outside for recess on Wednesday, October 4th. 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- We already have over 330 children signed up to participate! There will be bright colors and bracelets this year. The DJ has been contacted and 250 shirts have been ordered. Dina Lindner is also chairing this event again. We need to discuss safety plans for the younger children. We plan to have fourth grade helpers lead the Kindergarten students on their own for the first few minutes of the event and then release each subsequent grade in two minute intervals. A volunteer signup for throwing color, directing children and giving out bracelets will go out soon. We encourage teachers and staff to participate at one of the stations if they have time on the afternoon of Friday, October 13th. The plan is to have the children run in heats.
