Lego League finished their projects this month and presented their work at our science fair. It was exciting to see all of the students' final projects and the excitement on their faces as they explained to families their thought process and how they coded their projects. Nicole Castellano, our chair, put an incredible amount of time and effort into the program making it the largest yet with a total of twenty four students (12 boys, 12 girls) participating. 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
