

SPFHS Senior Wins in VFW Voice of Democracy Program



SPFHS Senior Cara Argila recently won first place in the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Voice of Democracy Audio Essay Program for Memorial Post 10122 in Scotch Plains-Fanwood.

Argila was awarded a Certificate of Merit and a \$300 cash prize. She now advances to the NJ VFW state competition where she'll continue competing against other high school students from the state for a chance at the national competition and larger scholarship prize.

The VFW Voice of Democracy Audio Essay Program is a yearly competition which invites high school students to express their perspectives on democratic or patriotic themes. This year's theme asked students to consider why veterans are important.

Argila's compelling audio essay explained how veterans are "real-life superheroes" who have "saved our country and numerous others countless times.

Although their jobs are physically and mentally demanding, require years of service, and sometimes, traumatize them permanently, they complete the most important task: protecting the country they love and its people."



Art Teacher Publishes Second Book, Inspired by Students





Coles Elementary School Art Teacher Rahama Alvi has published her second children's book, "The Crayons and the Glue."

Alvi collaborated with her husband to write and publish the first book, "The Ramadan Tree," in February 2022. This second book is a solo project; Alvi produced both the words and illustrations for "The Crayons and the Glue."

"I love teaching in part because the students inspire me," she said. "I have dedicated my second book to my students because they teach me something new every day."

The idea for "The Crayons and the Glue" came to Alvi after observing a school competition led by school librarian Stephanie Giannacio, in which students tried to disguise gingerbread persons as something else.

"In my book, brand-new crayons are excited to start the school year until they find out from an older crayon what could happen to them," she adds. "He tells them that the children sometimes tear off the paper and break the crayon's tips when they are coloring. At first, they panic, but Glue helps them to create disguises using the materials in the art room."

When Alvi read "The Crayons and the Glue" to her students at Coles, they were especially excited to see that the illustrations of the book's classroom look a lot like their own art room. Additionally, they loved discovering that the last several pages are coloring pages and an activity that allows them to create their own crayon disguise.

"I hope that 'The Crayons and the Glue' will be enjoyed by many students," Alvi said. "For the youngest readers, it offers a fun way to review colors, and for the upper elementary students, it taps their creativity and problem-solving skills."

Fei was named one of the semifinalists in the National Merit Scholarship Program in the fall.
