A Message From the Superintendent & Business Administrator

Dear SPF Community,

At the March 24, 2022 Board of Education meeting, the board unanimously adopted a school budget that supports our students and maximizes our community's investment in education. The General Fund budget of just under \$107.7 million is designed to support the goals of our new Strategic Plan, fund ongoing pandemic recovery, and provide for our students academically, socially, and emotionally.





Funding highlights for 2022-2023 include:

- Curriculum support, including new engineering and mathematics courses, Teachers College Reading and Writing Workshop, social and emotional learning, and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion initiatives
- Continued focus on learning acceleration and intervention efforts, and our One-to-One technology device program
- Program enhancements at the middle school including the examination of time allocation

This year our district received an additional \$1.9 million in state aid and - like many of you balancing your home budgets – we face rising expenses and unprecedented inflation. We're challenged by national bus driver shortages, natural gas prices rising 50%, higher costs for workers' compensation insurance due to the pandemic, local pension contributions, and more.

To cover these expenses, the tax rate will rise slightly: 1.43% on average in Scotch Plains and 1.04% in Fanwood. That is under the 2% budget cap allowed by the state due to 38% debt reduction and translates to about \$133 for a home in Scotch Plains and \$84 for a home in Fanwood.

Our communities are growing. The new housing developments in tandem with the redevelopment of downtown Scotch Plains will increase our student enrollment. While our school buildings are near capacity, we're excited to meet these new challenges. We're in the early stages of planning a bond referendum that will help address this need for more space. We anticipate sharing more information and more details about this in the upcoming school year.

Community support for the budget is what allows the district to continue to provide access to world class academics, athletics, and the arts. We look forward to building on our strong foundation for a *strong future*.


We'll cheer them on as they head to Princeton High School for the State Finals on Saturday, April 30.
